TOP 3 EMERGING GMAIL THREATS

Heads up! Gmail's more secure than ever, but hackers are getting craftier. Here's what you need to know— and fast fixes you can do today.

1. AI-POWERED PHISHING

- Scammers use AI to craft emails that look exactly like your bank, boss, or even your own IT team.
- Fix: Slow down—double-check the sender address and hover over links before clicking.

2. ZERO-DAY EXPLOITS

- Hackers find brand-new Gmail vulnerabilities and strike before Google patches them.
- Fix: Keep your browser and extensions updated. Enable automatic security patches.

3. QUANTUM COMPUTING RISKS

- Future quantum machines could crack today's encryption—putting passwords and 2FA in jeopardy.
- Fix: Use a passphrase-style password (three unrelated words) and enable hardware security keys.

QUICK WINS TO LOCK DOWN YOUR INBOX

- Strong Password + 2FA.
- Create a long, unique password and turn on two-factor authentication (use an app, not SMS).
- Security Checkup.
- Visit Google's Security Checkup page quarterly to review devices, apps, and recovery info.
- Unsubscribe & Delete.
- Slash your attack surface: Unsubscribe from newsletters you don't read and delete old accounts.

WHERE DO DELETED FILES REALLY GO?

- Deleting doesn't mean gone—here's the scoop and how to wipe for good.
- Recycle Bin ≠ Erased. Files stay until you empty the bin (they're just "hidden").
- Free Space, Not Gone Space. Once the bin's empty, your data sits in "free space" until overwritten.
- Recoverable Until Overwritten. Specialized tools can snag "deleted" files if nothing new has replaced them.

Quick Secure Delete:

1. Use built-in secure-erase (e.g., Windows "cipher /w" or macOS FileVault).

- 2. Try a reputable file-shredder app for one-click wiping.
- 3. Always back up before you purge-then purge with confidence.
